In 2011, the Pechanga Band of Luiseno Indians began administration of its own Tribal TANF program for enrolled Pechanga Tribal members, and federally recognized enrolled American Indian families living on the Pechanga Indian Reservation. Tribal Assistance for Native Families (TANF), is a Federal and State funded program that provides time-limited assistance to “needy” and “relative caretaker” families with a child in an effort for those children to be cared for in their homes or in the homes of their relatives.

OUR VISION

Pechanga Tribal TANF’s vision is to empower, educate, and promote cultural values that preserve the traditional American Indian family unit by providing the opportunity for improvement in the quality of life that leads to sustainable self-sufficiency.

THE PECHANGA TRIBAL TANF SERVICE AREA INCLUDES:

- ➔ The Pechanga Indian Reservation
- ➔ The off reservation area of Orange County.
- ➔ The off reservation area of Riverside County.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE:

- ➔ All enrolled Pechanga Tribal members, members of federally recognized Tribes, AI/AN members of the California Judgment Roll, their families and descendants who reside on the Pechanga Reservation.
- ➔ Enrolled Pechanga Tribal members and their families who reside in the off-reservation areas of Orange County & Riverside County.
- ➔ Relative Caregivers to a minor child (ren) under 18 years of age.
- ➔ You must have a minor dependent child in the home.
- ➔ Individuals expecting a child are eligible in their third trimester of pregnancy.
- ➔ Only one member of the household is required to be Native American.
- ➔ Must meet all other Pechanga Tribal TANF eligibility requirements.
